## TRALIA

lding in Australia is a 'once in a lifetime' as pompous and big as the couple can The ceremony itself can be a casual affair





where the guests don't usually dress for the occasion but it is at the reception where they change and practically 'show off' in their best outfits and gowns! It is also very common for many of the guests not to attend the ceremony, although they will all be present at the reception. Church ceremonies often have the 'unity' candles, (see my comments on America). Traditionally, the couple save the top part of the wedding cake to eat on their first anniversary and the second layer for the christening of the first baby.

### STEAL

- 1. Rather then a formal greeting line take a tip from the Aussies and announce the wedding party instead. Invite all your guests into dinner then line up the wedding party outside the room. Each couple of the bridal party and parents are announced into the room individually with huge applause and

# **AMERICA**

Americans and English are renowned for having a close relationship, and falling in love is no exception. Regardless of whether it is an American girl or boy, they love coming to the UK to marry. I have seen many of their traditions transfer to weddings here that I almost feel American! Most weddings in the US will have a rehearsal ensuring the wedding party know where to walk, at what speed and where to sit. After the rehearsal is a dinner for the wedding party and immediate family. It's a fantastic chance for families to meet in a more informal, intimate atmosphere. Rather than ushers, the groom has 'groomsmen' and there will normally be an even number of men to the bridesmaids. At the ceremony the bridesmaids walk down the aisle first on beautiful monogrammed aisle runners. They are then followed by the bride and her father.
